
MS. TAHIRA RAZA APPOINTED AS PRESIDENT FIRST WOMEN BANK LIMITED







The Federal Government, in terms of Section 11(3) (a) of the Bank's Nationalization Act 1974, has appointed Ms. Tahira Raza as President, First Women Bank Limited (FWBL) with immediate effect, for a term of

three (3) years.

Prior to her appointment as President FWBL, Ms. Raza was working with the National Bank of Pakistan

as SEVP, CRO & Group Chief Risk Management.

Ms. Raza's track record has proven her to be a banker par excellence and a mission driven leader for the socio-economic development of the country. She started her banking career with MCB in 1975. In 1989, Ms. Raza opted to join First Women Bank and became one of the founding executives of FWBL.

After serving FWBL for 14 years, she joined NBP. Ms. Raza's interest, persistence and commitment enabled her to avail opportunities which helped in shaping her into a competent and successful banker. In 2012, she was honored to be the first woman SEVP in one of the largest banks in the country - NBP.

She holds an MBA degree in Banking and Finance from the Institute of Business Administration (IBA), Karachi and DAIBP from the Institute of Bankers in Pakistan.

Ms. Tahira Raza has presented numerous papers on Credit, Risk Management and Banking & Finance at national and international conferences, seminars and symposia. Apart from her professional achievements, she is also a keen golfer.

## PM'S YOUTH BUSINESS LOANS FIRST BALLOTING

The Government of Pakistan, in December 2013, launched six schemes to reduce unemployment and empower the youth of Pakistan. The Prime Minister's Youth Business Loans (PMYBL) is one such program which provides business loans to 21 - 45 year old young men and women, especially the educated: up to two million rupees at the concessionary price of 8 percent.

In this scheme, 50% of total loans have been allocated for women and 5% quota has been reserved for the families of shaheed, widows and disabled persons to start their own businesses. Initially, these loans are provided by the First Women Bank Limited and National Bank of Pakistan.

All 41 FWBL branches in 24 cities are authorized to provide these loans. Special counters have been set up to facilitate women applicants.

The first electronic balloting for the scheme took place at the Convention Center, Islamabad, on February 28, 2014. Addressing the Ceremony, Prime Minister Muhammad Nawaz Sharif said that the Government is committed to empowering the youth by providing them Rs. 3.7 billion in easy loans as it would not only help the country, but also strengthen national economy. The Prime Minister said that in the past up to 70% of the youth population had no access to loans, as only influential businessmen were eligible to get loans from banks. He said that the youth would lead the nation, as in the developed countries, 80% of the youth were playing their role in strengthening the economy.

He said that the youth should come forward by starting their own businesses in various sectors which would not only benefit them, but they would also be in a position to provide jobs to other people. The Prime Minister particularly urged women and the youth of KPK, Sindh and Balochistan to take advantage of the loan scheme.

He said around 38,000 applications, including 28,000 from Punjab, 600 from Islamabad (Capital Territory), 3,500 from KPK, 100 from Gilgit Baltistan, 1,000 from Balochistan, 500 from AJK and 3,000 from Sindh, were received. He said out of these applications 6,127 were approved for balloting, of which 5,399 would be given loans. The Prime Minister said that the applicants were selected according to the provincial quota and that 100,000 loans would be awarded in one year. Later, the Prime Minister performed electronic balloting of the applications for awarding of loans.



Earlier, the Federal Minister for Finance, Mr. Ishaq Dar, said that the future of country's economy depends on making the youth self-sufficient. He asked banks to be a part of this scheme.

The balloting selected sixty four (64) applicants for receiving the Prime Minister's Youth Business Loans through First Women Bank Limited.


