PRIME MINISTER ANNOUNCES YOUTH BUSINESS LOANS



EMPOWERING WOMEN

Prime Minister Mian Muhammad Nawaz Sharif, in his second address to the nation, announced the launch of six schemes including easy business loans, with an aim to enable the youth of the country to stand on their

feet besides helping to strengthen the economy. Under the Scheme, loans up to two million rupees will be given to the youth, especially the educated, looking to establish or extend business enterprises at a concessionary mark-up of 8 percent; the remaining burden of the mark-up will be borne by the Government. All Pakistani young men and women aged between 21 and 45, with entrepreneurial potential, will be eligible for the Scheme with 50 percent quota reserved for women.

Initially these loans will be provided by National Bank of Pakistan and First Women Bank Ltd.

The Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF) and Pakistan Microfinance Network (PMN), in collaboration with the Government of Pakistan and its agencies, International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), The World Bank and UKAID, organized the 'Microfinance Summit Pakistan 2013'. The aim of this Summit was to bring together industry leaders, researchers, practitioners and investors from around the world to share experiences and insights on Microfinance.

Ms. Charmaine Hidayatullah, Acting President & CEO, was invited as a speaker at the plenary session titled 'Appreciating the Differences & Linkages between Livelihood, Financial Safety Nets and Financial Access'.

Speaking at the Conference, Ms. Hidayatullah said that the concept of this Summit represents a hope, a desire, an opportunity, an aspiration and most importantly, a commitment to overcome the multifaceted challenges facing the world. A few of the major challenges facing the world are poverty, hunger and starvation. Millions of human souls on this planet are living under extreme poverty and very inhumane conditions. Women are 70 percent of the world's poor. Two-thirds of those are not taught to read and write, although they do two-thirds of the world's work. They earn only one-tenth of the world's income and own less than 1 percent of the world's property. They are among the poorest of the world's poor.

"To overcome these horrific facts I feel that there is no tool, no remedy for developing more effectively than the empowerment of women", she emphasized.

Commercial banks are traditionally reluctant to finance small loans, mainly because of high transaction costs and lack of expertise to handle these kinds of loans. Instead of considering this as an additional opportunity for investment, they consider it as a losing proposition. Highlighting the role of First Women Bank in the country, Ms. Hidayatullah said that FWBL was the first



commercial bank to launch micro-credit in Pakistan. The FWBL model caters to women at all levels of economic activity - micro, small, medium and corporate. Most importantly, the Bank provides women with the support services required to navigate the obstacles pertaining to the development of business. By doing so, FWBL is helping them emerge as key players in the national and global economy.

The activities started with the hosting of the Training Fairs, at both the Karachi and Lahore centres. The purpose of the Training Fairs was to assess the training needs of women in different fields. On the basis of the survey, it was revealed that women should train in the areas of Business Entrepreneurship, Food Production, Tailoring, Fashion Designing, Computer Literacy, Beauty, Housekeeping, Product Development and Marketing. All trainings were organized in collaboration with the top institutes of the country. Advertisements were placed in the national dailies and on the website of the Bank. Nominations were also invited by girls' colleges and NGOs. The overall success of trainings carried can be assessed from the feedback given by the women who have benefitted from the

trainings. The changes before and after the trainings are testimony to the confidence gained and the views expressed by them.
