FWBL LAUNCHES LOW-COST HOUSING FINANCE FOR A SPECIAL SEGMENT


Pakistan is the seventh-most heavily populated country in the world. According to the Census conducted in 2017, its population is 207.7 million. Like any other developing country, Pakistan has been facing a shortage of housing units. The current urban housing demand in Pakistan is 350,000 units. Of this, 62% is for lower-income groups while 25% is for lower-middle income groups. Lack of affordability is a key factor depriving the low-income strata of the population from full access to institutionalized housing finance to meet their housing needs.

First Women Bank Limited has recently launched a Low-Cost Housing Scheme for the lower-income strata, including widows, children of Shaheed, transgenders, special persons (having physical disabilities) and people in the areas severely affected by the war against terrorism. The product is specially targeted towards lower-income groups with lower mark-up rates to make the provision of economic empowerment affordable.

This facility can be utilized for the purchase of residential plots plus construction at affordable rates.

The applicant/co-applicant must be a salaried person (Govt., Semi-Govt., Autonomous Bodies/Multinational Companies, Pensioners/ Widows) or Self-employed Businessperson/ Professional, must not own any residential housing unit/flat/apartment, should not have availed any housing finance facility previously from any bank/DFI, and the monthly income of the borrower/co-borrower should not be less than Rs. 25,000. Under the scheme, the borrower can avail a minimum of Rs. 500,000/to a maximum of Rs. 2,700,000/-. The loan is available at a fixed rate of 5% for the tenure. which is a minimum of 2 years to a maximum of 12 years, with a maximum of 6 months' grace period. BIOMETRIC ACCOUNT VERIFICATION OF OVERSEAS PAKISTANIS



In light of the problems being faced by overseas Pakistanis in operating their biometrically unverified bank accounts, the State Bank of Pakistan has issued detailed guidelines on the alternative arrangements made to facilitate their verification.

As per these arrangements, overseas Pakistanis are required to get in touch with their respective banks through an e-mail/surface mail for the provision of identity documents like a valid CNIC, Visa, Passport and NICOP (National Identity Card for Overseas Pakistanis) for biometric verification to be able to keep their bank accounts operational.

FWBL is extending its fullest cooperation to its overseas customers in this regard.

Small & Medium Enterprises make up nearly 90% of all the enterprises in

Pakistan, employ nearly 80% of the non-agricultural workforce, and their share in the annual GDP is approximately 40%. However, as opposed to large enterprises, small and medium enterprises are deprived of financial and other resources required by any enterprise to prosper. This intrinsic characteristic of SMEs makes it crucial that a mechanism is put in place for the support of these SMEs in various aspects of business such as marketing, human resource development, financial & technical support, etc. Supporting SME development has always been one of the priority areas for FWBL. The Bank has redefined itself as a niche player with the focus on the 'S' of the SME market segment. In this regard, the Bank frequently organizes SME product awareness sessions to push entrepreneurs to pursue their dreams, as well as organizes training sessions for the team, so that they are fully well-versed with techniques, market trends and SBP Regulations. Below are the details of the sessions organized for FWBL employees and the general public.

SME TRAININGS FOR EMPLOYEES IN KARACHI & LAHORE

While addressing both sessions held in Karachi and Lahore, Ms. Naushaba Shahzad, President & CEO (A) FWBL, reminded the participants that FWBL believes in engaging with its customers through the entire process of lending and helping out wherever it can. FWBL offers SME products to its customers, especially women, with the core purpose to truly identify, support and empower women in business. In Karachi, the training session was held at the Mövenpick Hotel while in Lahore it was held at the Maisonette Hotel, and these were attended by 22 and 24 officers respectively.


